When the centennial ended the Korean American Foundation, Hawaii formed and made the Korea Festival as one of its major initiatives. 





부대찌개-Budae Jjigae By Chef Miyoung Weddle

Sauce Ingredients:

- 1 TBSP Gochugaru
- 1 TBSP Gochujang
- 1 1/2 TBSP Garlic, minced
- 1 TBSP Soy Sauce
- 1 TBSP Soju

Procedure for making the Sauce:

- Combine the Gochugaru, Gochujang, Garlic, Soy Sauce, and Soju and mix until combined.
- 2. Reserve on the side for later use.

Budae Jjigae Ingredients:

1 can Spam, sliced into half inch sized pieces 2–3 ea. Sausages, thin sliced on a bias Thin Sliced Pork Belly, Ground Pork Ball, or Bacon, (Pork Belly can be sliced into thin flat pieces)

½ cup Lentils, par cooked

½ block Tofu, sliced into half inch sized pieces ½ ea. Onion, Large (or use 1 small Onion),

sliced into thin strips

1 bunch Leeks or Green Onions, sliced into thin

strips

½ cup Kimchi, chopped

To Taste Sauce, from above recipe


35 oz. Beef, Chicken, or Vegetable Stock/Broth

Optional: Mushrooms / Dumplings / Noodles

Budae Jjigae Procedure:

- In a pot, cook the lentils in boiling water.
 Lentils should be lightly cooked. Reserve on
 the side.
- Arrange meats, tofu, kimchi and vegetables in a shallow pot or hot pot style pot. Add half the sauce.
- 3. Pour the broth or stock over the vegetable and sauce and bring to a boil.
- Once it comes to a boil, reduce heat to a simmer. Adjust the seasonings of the broth base by adding more sauce if you prefer.
- Once meat is thoroughly cooked and your broth is well seasoned, enjoy! You can add your choice of noodles or dumplings if you prefer.

떡볶이- Spicy Rice Cake by Palama Supermarket

Ingredients

- 1 pound rice cake (ttoekbokki)
- 1 sheet of fish cake (oden)
- 4 ounces head cabbage (cut in 2 inches squares)
- 1 round onion
- 1 2 scallions (cut in 4 inches long)
- 3 cups water

Sauce Mixture

- 3 tablespoons Korean red chili pepper paste (gochujang)
- 1 3 teaspoons Korean red chili pepper flakes (gochugaru)
- optional for extra heat
 1 tablespoon soy sauce
- 2 tablespoon sugar
- 2 teaspoons minced garlic
- 1 teaspoon sesame oil
- 1 teaspoon sesame seeds (garnish)

Optional to add Instant dried noodle (Ra-myun-Sa-Ri), Hard Boiled eggs, Mozzarella Cheese **How to**

- Add water to a large pan. Mix sauce in the sauce, except the sesame oil to the pan.
 Bring it to a boil over medium high heat and stir to all the ingredients mixed well.
- 2. Add the rice cake. Stir occasionally to not to stick to each other or on the bottom of the pan. When the rice cake is nice and soft,
- 3. Add onion, head cabbage and scallion and stir well for another 4-6 minutes until the desired texture of the vegetable.
- 4. Add sesame oil and sesame seeds.
- 5. Serve immediately
- 6. For optional addition, you can add cooked instant dried noodle or hard boiled eggs or put mozzarella cheese on top right before you serve.



해물파전-Seafood Pancake (Haemul Pajeon) By **Yakiniku Seoul**

Ingredients

1-2 cups of assorted seafood (squid, shrimp, mussels, etc)

1 cup of Korean pancake mix (buchim garu)

1 tablespoon of sesame oil

1 bunch of scallions (cut into 1 inch pieces)

3/4 cup of cold water

4 tablespoons of vegetable oil per pancake

INSTRUCTIONS

- Prepare the seafood by cutting it into bite size pieces. Make sure to drain the excess water. Mix the seafood with the sesame oil.
- 2. Cut the scallions into 1 inch pieces.
- 3. In a large bowl, mix the pancake mix with ¾ cup of cold water. The batter should be thin. If you need more water, add 1 more tablespoon.
- 4. Mix in the seafood and the scallions into the batter.
- 5. Heat up vegetable oil in a nonstick pan over medium high heat. Ladle the pancake batter onto the pan and arrange the scallions neatly. The pancake batter should be spread evenly and relatively thin. Cook for 3-4 minutes or until the pancake is golden brown. If the pancake is browning too fast, reduce the heat to medium.
- 6. Turn it over and cook for another 3-4 minutes or until the pancake is golden brown. Serve hot off the pan with your favorite dipping sauce.


