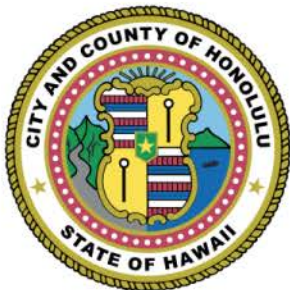

Located in Chinatown, O'Kims Korean Kitchen showcases Chef Kim's talent in creating modern Korean fusion cuisine. Her monthly specials draw locals and visitors to her doorstep as they eagerly devour her culinary creations. Focusing on traditional Korean flavors with a modern twist, O'Kims has captured Gold for the Best Overall Korean for two consecutive years from Honolulu Magazine's prestigious Hale 'Aina Awards. Her restaurant also consistently ranks in the top spots for Korean eateries in Hawaii on Yelp.

Chef Kim's passion for food and cuisine stemmed from the variety of food in her hometown of Busan, South Korea. She got her first restaurant job at the age of 16 and is a Culinary Arts graduate of Kapiolani Community College. Her training under notable chefs such as Chef Mavro and honing her knowledge and skills in Japanese, Korean, and international cuisines in the kitchens of Morimoto and Vintage Cave only further fueled her passion for food.

In 2016 she opened O'Kims in a tiny space: no seating area, one employee, and two portable butane stoves. With a lot of persistence and hard work, she grew to her current day restaurant space: 22 tables to seat up to 55 guests with 12 staff on board. Some of her notable menu creations are her Seaweed Salmon, Confit Pork Belly Brulee, her vegan Garbanzo Curry, and her exciting Monthly Specials. O'Kims is also proud to be one of the featured restaurants for Lanakila Meals on Wheels' 15th Annual "The Good Table" to help raise funds to reduce food insecurity among the local kupuna (elderly).

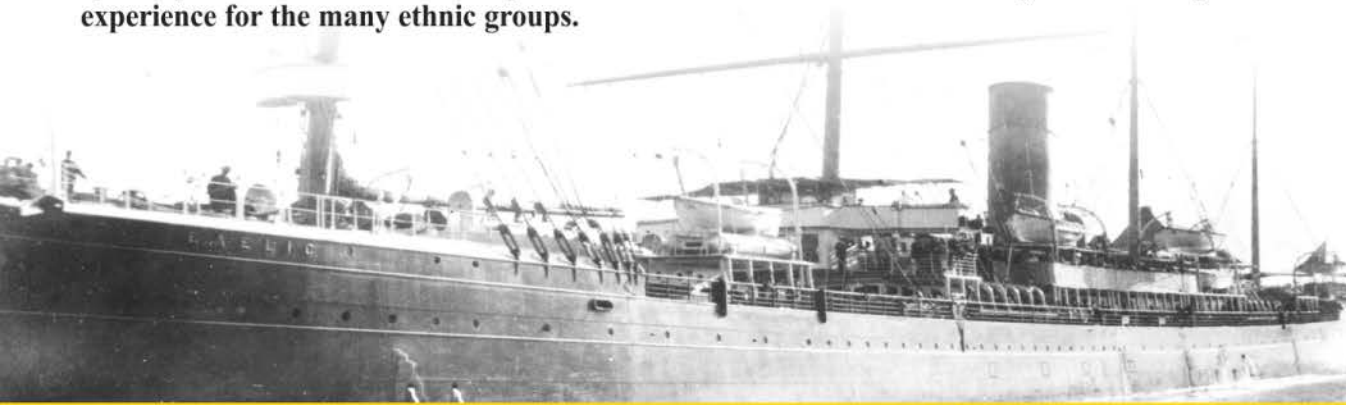

Ingredients

Dducbokgi dduck (rice cake)
Arabiki sausage
Oil for frying
Gochujang 1cup
Ketchup 2cup
Honey 1cup
Sugar 1cup
Soy sauce ½ cup
Minced garlic 2T

How to

1. In a sauce pot add everything bring to simmer until sugar is dissolved and set a side with a brush.
2. Blench dduckbokgi and arabiki sausage and coat with sesame oil.
3. Skewer the dduck and sausages alternatingly to any desire size.
4. In a pan add oil frying until the dduck get soft.
5. And brush the prepared sauce sprinkle sesame seed or peanuts on top to taste.

Ingredients (for 4-6 servings)

3 lbs beef short ribs,
Sauce mix (Mix in a mixing bowl),
1/3 cup soy sauce
1/3 cup water, 1/2 cup sugar,
1 ts ground black pepper,
1/2 Korean pear
9 cloves of garlic,
1 medium onion,
1 tsp minced ginger,
2 tbsp sesame oil

How to

1. Trim excess fat from the Short Rib
2. Put Short ribs in the water for 1 hour. This step is to remove blood from meat.
3. Wash the short ribs with cold water and drain water and pat dry.
4. Mix all of the sauce ingredients in a mixing bowl
5. Use a Ziploc or a container to marinate the meat with the sauce mix. Refrigerate overnight or at least 6 hours.
6. Cook marinated meat for about 5-7 minutes and enjoy!

600g sliced pork shoulder,
1 onion, 1 green onion,
3 tablespoons of red pepper paste,
2 tablespoons of red pepper powder,
an appropriate amount of minced garlic,
a little bit of ginger powder,
an appropriate amount of canola oil,
4 tablespoons of sugar,
1 tablespoon mirin,
a little bit of sesame oil,
and 1 tablespoon of soy sauce

How to

1. Ingredients: Cut pork, onion, and green onion into easy-to-eat sizes.
2. Seasoning: Add red pepper paste, oligosaccharide, red pepper powder, minced garlic, sesame seeds, soy sauce, and ginger powder to make seasoning.
3. Mixing ingredients: Mix ingredients evenly so that the flavor of the seasoning is well absorbed.

Tip: You can use anchovy broth instead of water for a deeper taste.

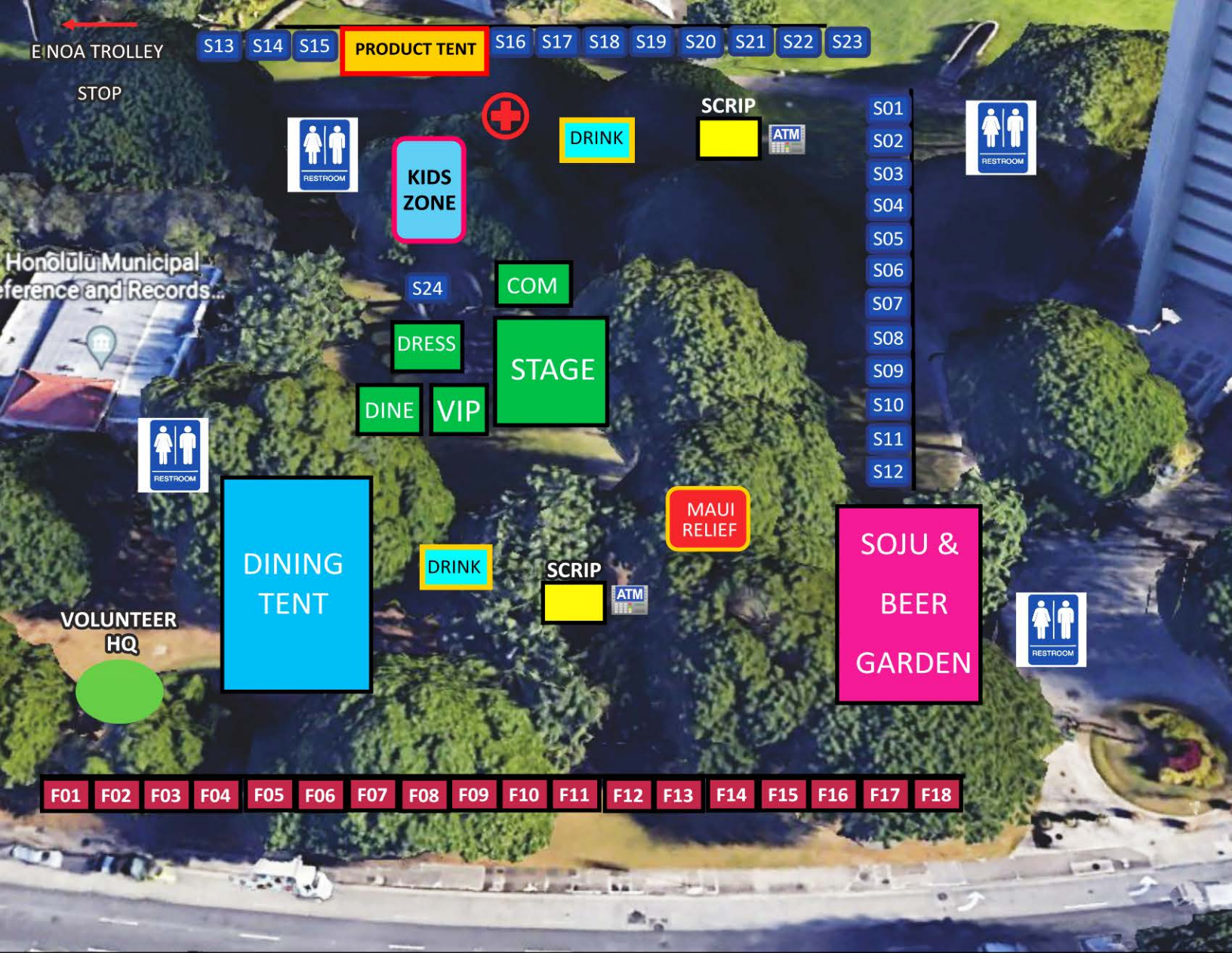
